PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

February has come and gone by quickly. Now, the "March Madness" begins!

With spring right around the corner, it can be hard to keep children focused on learning. **Make school attendance a priority**. Let your child know that unless they're sick, they must go to school. Attendance is important!

"It's just one day, Mom," your child says. "Missing one day won't hurt, will it?"

The answer is **yes** – missing school will hurt! Each day's learning builds on what was done the day before, so a child who misses a day has missed an important building block. Being in school every day – and on time- will help your child do well. If he or she is not in school, they can't learn. If he or she is late, they may miss something important. To promote regular attendance:

- **Tell your child** that you expect him or her to go to school every day. What's important to you is important to them.
- **Don't accept excuses.** Not feeling like getting out of bed isn't a good reason to stay home.
- Schedule medical appointments outside of school hours.
- Plan family vacations during school breaks.
- **Help your child** set the alarm clock earlier if he or she has trouble getting out of the house and to school before the bell.

Of course, if your child is truly sick, do keep your child home—especially if the illness is contagious.

LENT

Easter might not seem as big of a deal as Christmas, but the truth is, it's a BIGGER deal. Jesus rose from the dead! Before we get into the joy of Easter, we have a lot of preparing to do, a sort of spring cleaning of our souls. In the church year, this time is called Lent.

Lent is the time we set aside before Easter to help us clear out the things that get in the way of our goal of eternal life in heaven. We have a lot of clutter and sin separating us from God.

For most of us, however, spending forty days —six long weeks- in a penitential mode is challenging, and it's easy to lose steam and give up on the whole thing. Try to plan a quiet moment each day, and spend it together as a family praying and reflecting upon scripture readings, praying the rosary, or creating your own prayers as an offering to Jesus as a means to deepen your faith.

As we journey through the Lenten season, our students will have the opportunity to participate in several meaningful activities that focus on the three pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We will pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday afternoon, participate in a "Pie in the Face" contest on "PI" day to raise funds for the Missionary Childhood Association, students will participate in classroom initiated activities that focus on the Corporal Works of Mercy, "fasting" from five minutes of recess daily to pray for others, receiving the sacrament of penance, and reflecting on classroom scripture readings.

May your Lent be filled with blessings this year, and may your Easter be more joyful due to your time spent together throughout the days ahead. Our reward, our hope, will be eternal life with Jesus in heaven.

After the chocolate bunnies are long gone, we still have before us our risen Savior. He is the reason for our alleluias, and the hope we hold on to long after Easter.

SPRING FUNDRAISER

Since we had such a positive response last year, once again, we will be participating in the Hoss's Dinner Kit fundraiser this spring.
